fiction	Any story that is the product of imagination rather than fact. FAKE, Made up				
nonfiction	Writing that includes factual information.				
	Articles, reports, informational, autobiographies and biographies.				
characters	Who or what a story is about.				
setting	Time and place a story unfolds				
plot	Structure of a story, sequence of events that happen in a story				
rising action	Events in the story that lead up to the climax. (builds suspense)				
climax	Most exciting part of the story or the turning of events.				
falling action	Events that happen after the climax that lead you toward the ending.				
resolution	Ending part of a story where a conflict is resolved				
conflict	Struggle or a problem in the story.  - Man vs. Man - Man vs. Self - Man vs. Nature				
theme	The "big idea" or life lesson the story teaches				

	Skill/Direction Words				
Central idea	Central or main point of the text, overall what the text is mainly about				
summarizing	To capture all the most important parts of the original text, but condensing them as much as possible in the reader's own words.				
inference	Judgement based on reasoning rather than a direct statement. Conclusion based on clues in the story "reading between the lines"				
generalization	Conclusion or broad statement about a topic. What most people would conclude about something.				
evidence (in reading)	Information or details from a text that support a reader's assertion ex: quotations, paraphrasing, descriptions				
compare	Explaining how two or more things are alike				
contrast	Explaining how two or more things are different				
context clues	Using words or sentences around an unknown word to understand the meaning of the unknown word.				
structure	How information in a text is organized Chronological, comparison/contrast, cause/effect, problem/solution, list/description, question/answer				
Author's point of view/purpose	The author's opinion or feelings about the text they write about. The author's reason or intention for writing a text.				
explicit	Clearly expressed or fully stated in the actual text				
distinct	Specific, clearly defined, certain				
contribute	To be an important fact in; help to a cause
